Basic Agenda: We will travel Sat. from Boston to Seattle/Tacoma. We will meet at the airport in

the morning at 5:00 a.m. > fly out of Logan at 7 a.m. > arrive in Seattle at 10:17 a.m. > we will pick up our rental vehicles at the airport and drive to the ferry (stopping for lunch on the way). Ride the ferry to Bainbridge Island. Stay on Bainbridge Island through Sunday afternoon. Take the ferry on Sunday back to the mainland, and drive to Auburn, WA to Black Diamond Camps where we will be staying the remainder of our time. Monday – Thursday we will travel each morning to our work sites and arrive back at our lodging at the end of the day. Saturday we

fly home at 3:20 p.m. and arrive at Boston Logan airport at 11:55 p.m.

➤ We will work with Citizen's For a Healthy Bay – working to restore a wetland site. Citizens for a Healthy Bay is a nonprofit environmental organization working side-by-side with local citizens, businesses and government to prevent water pollution and make their community more sustainable. - We will work with the Pierce Conservation District who works with local landowners and public agencies to conserve natural resources that are essential to both their economy and their region's quality of life.
