#### "LITTLE ADVENT MUSIC" NOTES

Hugo Distler was born in Nuremberg and attended Leipzig Conservatory studying piano, organ, conducting and composition. As an established teacher, he taught in Württemburg, then in Berlin. He is known today primarily for his sacred music in the Neo-Baroque style.

"Little" only refers to the number of instruments employed in Advent Music. Distler conducted the first performance on November 29, 1931 at the St. Jacobikirche in Lübeck. He had come to this position directly from his study at the Leipzig Conservatory. At this time Lübeck was highly resistant to Nazi pressures against the church, therefore life for a church musician was difficult for a rising composer. His music was often labeled "degenerate" from some party officials. Distler moved his family to Stuttgart in 1937 and focused more on secular music. There he became more and more depressed over the death of friends, mounting aerial attacks, the daily threats living under Nazi rule, and the pressures of attempting to serve God while trying to appease authorities. Tragically, Distler took his own life at age 34.

Little Advent Music is based on the Chorale tune "Nun Komm der Heiden Heliand", a chorale used during Advent in German churches. The chorale tune appears in our New Century Hymnal, #64, but with a completely different text. The use of flute, oboe and violin provide charm and color as singers and narrators tell the story of Advent.

We hope the intimate chamber music-like quality of this contemplative piece will enrich your Advent.
