A Unique, Two-Year First Call Opportunity

As a Pastoral Resident at the Wellesley Village Church in Wellesley, Massachusetts you will

- **Be a full-time pastor**, participating in all aspects of the life of Wellesley Village Church and our partner congregation, the Congregational Church of Weston. The two settings provide the experience of working within the large staff of a large congregation and as solo pastor of a small one.
- **Gain experience in core areas of pastoral work:** Worship, Faith Formation, Pastoral Care, Transformational Leadership, Social Justice, and Professional Development.
- **Learn the basics of church management:** worship planning and leadership, staff management, church finances and stewardship, all with the support and mentorship of pastoral staff at Wellesley Village Church and congregations in Wellesley and Weston.
- **Be supported by a peer Resident, then mentor a peer:** the program trains two Residents at a time, and the staggered call process enables the more established Resident to mentor the newer.
- **Respond to the Spirit’s movement.** Personal spiritual development is supported by the program. So is participation in a New Clergy Group through the UCC’s Southern New England Conference.
- **Be Part of a** collaborative and dynamic team of experienced Pastors including Rev. Dr. Sarah S. Butter, Sr. Pastor, Rev. Pam Emslie and Rev. Stacy Swain Associate Pastors as well as talented Music and Education staff.

This position is an ordainable call in the UCC, with a salary and housing allowance of \$60,000 a year (or \$55,000 with free parsonage housing, if available), and full benefits.

The Kind of Person we are Looking for...

We are looking for a candidate who has discerned a call to parish ministry, has a passion for God's justice, a heart for Jesus' way of compassion, and an openness to the Holy Spirit. Excellent candidates have or will have graduated with an M.Div. within the last two years, be Members in Discernment in the UCC, be on track to be ordained within the time frame of the program, and be able to commit to serve from [August 2023-June 2025](#).

Who we are

Wellesley Village Church is an Open and Affirming congregation of the United Church of Christ, centered in the heart of Wellesley. Since 1798, faithful Christians have gathered here to worship the Triune God, grow in faith together and bear witness to the Gospel. We still believe that God is speaking and that we should listen. We marvel at the way God's love nurtures our own, Christ's grace transforms us, and the Holy Spirit's presence makes more of us together than we could be apart.



In 2019, we began an initiative to examine where we were and to imagine where the Holy Spirit might take us. After pausing for the pandemic, we picked up the visioning process last spring. The picture that emerged is of a community that chooses to love God and neighbor, both when it is easy and when it is not. Following Jesus' teaching, and energized by the Holy Spirit, we strive to make God's love real in a beautiful but broken world. These values are expressed in the solar panels on our roof, BLM banner on our wall, and the ministries our building houses. Those ministries include robust youth programs, Moms & Dads Groups, Family Life and Senior Life. At the center of it is meaningful worship, which nourishes, connects, and inspires us. Outside our walls, we help our neighbors with our community food service program, Village Table, and by our support of Family Promise Metrowest, City Mission Boston, and For His Children in Ecuador.

to be received no later than 5:00 PM on February 10, 2023*

- ◆ Completed application form (see below);
- ◆ A current resume;
- ◆ Two letters of reference. Please have two people write a letter about your gifts for pastoral ministry and your potential as a Pastoral Resident. Letters should be sent directly to the church;
- ◆ Two phone references. Please list two different people whom we can contact and who can also reflect on your gifts for pastoral ministry and your potential as a Pastoral Resident;
- ◆ Essay questions (500-750 words each):
 - ◇ Describe your call to pastoral ministry and how you see the Pastoral Residency Program supporting call;
 - ◇ Share a recent moment in ministry that was particularly successful or fulfilling;
 - ◇ Reflect on one of the Marks of Faithful and Effective Ministry* that is particularly present in your ministry, and another that you hope the Pastoral Residency Program will help you develop further.
